Knowledge exchange and and collaboration between universities and society: an afterthought or the main event?

Fulvio Esposito, from the Equality and Diversity Forum

With the new evaluation process brought in by the Research and Quality Assessment (VQR) 2015-2019, the so-called 'third mission' activities of universities entered a new phase. The action points proposed by the Italian National Agency for the Evaluation of Universities and Research Institutes (ANVUR) extend well beyond traditional technological transfer. This development is reflected in the five thematic areas identified for 'knowledge enhancement' in VQR 2020-2024. Another factor, which may have a significant impact on this context, is the ratification of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment. These changes raise a number of questions: is the existing regulatory framework still fit for purpose? Should new assessment criteria be introduced for individuals and institutions alongside new and different financing mechanisms? Is it still appropriate to view these activities as distinct from teaching and research and to refer to them as a 'third mission'?

Fulvio Esposito

Professor of Parasitology and, previously, Ordinary Professor at the University of Camerino (UNICAM), where he was also Rector and President of the Faculty of Sciences and Technology. Fulvio Esposito attended the University of Pisa and the Scuola Normale Superiore, where he obtained his Master's Degree and PhD in Biology respectively. His research has focused on various aspects of parasitology, including malaria. On these issues, he worked with the World Health Organisation (WHO) from the 80s until the early 2000s, spending much of this period in Africa where he participated in

the development of local universities. Since 2005 he has worked as an expert for the European Commission (DG Research and Innovation). He was Head of the Technical Secretariat of the Ministers for Education, University and Research. Since 2016, he has represented Italy at the OECD's Scientific and Technology Policies Committee (Paris). From 2020 to 2021, he coordinated MUR Working Group on the 'Role of universities in combatting social, economic and territorial inequalities' with Fabrizio Barca.
