12 April (Piani):

We discuss about the basic themes and principles of economic innovation (open innovation and technology transfer) and future prospects: In particular about the difference between invention and innovation and the economic trends to foster the growth. We will discuss innovation models and the many facets that make a product successful.

19 April (Piani):

The topic of intellectual property management and innovation processes is innovation is by its very nature cross-cutting. During the course, the topic will be treated both under the lens of legal protection under the lens of economic management, as well as under the lens of strategies of valorisation through technology transfer activities. Bearing in mind that the intersection of all these variables entails a not necessarily sequential approach will be examined, in particular about the legal profiles of intellectual property titles (patents, trademarks, know-how, design, copyright.), protectable subjects, protection requirements protection, duration, infringement of rights, writing methods and claims, classes of protection, granting and 'patent pending', publication, withdrawal of the application, exhaustion of the rights, the national and international filing procedures (the Italian patent, the PCT, international extensions, nationalisations) and the international search report.
